Re: Implementation of Mandatory Electronic Filing in Broome County Surrogate's

Court

I am pleased to provide the Bar and other interested persons with an update on the progress of the New York State Courts' Electronic Filing System ("NYSCEF"). The implementation of a mandatory e-filing program has been proposed by the District Administrative Judge of the 6<sup>th</sup> Judicial District for the **Broome County Surrogate's Court**. To date, successful consensual e-filing programs have been implemented in the Surrogate's Court in Broome, Chenango, Delaware, Otsego, and Tompkins Counties. It is expected that this mandatory program will be implemented on **October 21, 2020**, for newly filed probate and administration proceedings and miscellaneous proceedings relating thereto.

The NYSCEF system is intuitive and easy to use, and attorneys participating in our on-line training session can receive CLE credit(s) free of charge. Attorneys, paralegals and interested filers can register on-line for upcoming training sessions.

Please note that by legislation and statute all unrepresented parties are automatically exempt from participating in e-filing in any case. However, unrepresented parties may choose to e-file. Information on how to do so is available at <a href="http://www.nycourts.gov/efile-unrepresented">http://www.nycourts.gov/efile-unrepresented</a>. Attorneys who certify in good faith that they lack the requisite hardware, electronic connection or technical knowledge to participate in e-filing, may opt out of e-filing.

E-filing represents an important advance for the courts and the legal profession in New York State. We thank you for the wonderful support and cooperation you have shown and look forward to continuing to work closely with you as the program continues to move forward.
